Enclosed is DRAFT Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) Permit No. 4911-061-0001-P-01-0 for Yellow Pine Energy Company, LLC located at Georgia Highway 39 (Clay County) for the construction and operation of a 110-megawatt (MW) biomass-fired power plant. Also enclosed are the findings of Georgia EPD in the PSD Preliminary Determination. Please note that any construction may not commence until the final PSD Permit is issued.

The Public Notice, to be published by Yellow Pine Energy Company, LLC, is attached. Within fourteen days after receipt of this letter, the attached Public Notice shall be published once in The Cuthbert Southern Tribune, P. O. Box 257, 204 Maple Street, Cuthbert, GA 39840, 229-732-6016. You should notify Lynn Rhodes of our office at lynn.rhodes@dnr.state.ga.us at least 7 days prior to publication and inform her of the date on which the Public Notice will be published. A tear sheet of the Public Notice, showing the date of publication, must be submitted to the Division within 7 days following the date of publication. The "tear sheet" is the actual page from the newspaper in which the Public Notice is published.

Following the 30 day public comment period, as required by PSD regulations, and review by EPA and affected states, a final PSD Permit will be issued, incorporating any changes that result from comments received.
