Notice of Draft Groundwater Withdrawal Permit – Coweta County Water and Sewerage Authority – November 23, 2022

The Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD) announces its intent to issue Modified Groundwater Withdrawal Permit No. 038-0005 for water withdrawal of 0.654 MGD/ 0.604 MGD (Monthly Average/Annual Average in million gallons per day) from six well(s) in the Crystalline Rock aquifer for the purpose of a central water supply.

GW Permit No. 038-0004 (Shoal Creek Waterworks, Inc.) is being merged with GW Permit No. 038-0005 (Coweta County Water and Sewerage Authority). The cumulative permit limits (0.654 mgd monthly & 0.604 mgd annual avg.), and the cumulative number of wells (six) will remain unchanged.
