## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING AND 110(I) NONINTERFERENCE DEMONSTRATION SIP SUBMITTAL

## TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND PARTIES:

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to the authority set forth below, the Environmental Protection Division (hereinafter, "EPD") of the Georgia Department of Natural Resources proposes amendments to Georgia's State Implementation Plan (SIP). The proposed revision is described below:

**Rule 391-3-1-.02(2)(mmm), "NOx Emissions from Stationary Gas Turbines and Stationary Engines used to Generate Electricity,"** is being revised to add an exemption to allow the electric utilities to utilize emergency generators to provide power to the electric grid during periods of power interruption or severe weather events. The rule is also being revised to add clarity to the definition of emergency standby stationary gas turbines and stationary engines, add a definition for emergency standby stationary engines at data centers, update a citation, correct grammar, and fix typographical errors. This rule update will align the State rule with the Federal rule. Rule 391-3-1-.02(2)(mmm) will be submitted as a SIP revision to EPA.

As part of the SIP revision, EPD is also including a demonstration, consistent with section 110(1) of the Clean Air Act (CAA) that shows the added exemption will not interfere with continued maintenance of the 1997, 2008, and 2015 8-hour ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS), attainment of any other NAAQS, or any other CAA requirement as prescribed in section 110(1) of the CAA.

This notice is being provided to all persons who have requested in writing that they be placed on a notification list.
