BACKGROUND

On June 29, 2004, C-E Minerals submitted applications for air quality permits to remove operating hour limitations on the Bauxite Grinding Circuit located at Plant 1 (Emission Unit ID No. BG29) and the two Barmac Crushers (Emission Unit ID No. BC13 and IC40) and the Casting System (Emission Unit ID No. IC43) located at Plant 2. Plant 1 is located at Highway 49 and Plant 2 is located at Highway 195, both in Andersonville (Sumter County), Georgia.

On January 4, 2005, the Division issued a Preliminary Determination stating that the removal of operating hour limitations on the Bauxite Grinding Circuit located at Plant 1 (Emission Unit ID No. BG29) and the two Barmac Crushers (Emission Unit ID No. BC13 and IC40) and the Casting System (Emission Unit ID No. IC43) per Application Nos15447 and 15449 should be approved. The Preliminary Determination contained a draft Air Quality Permits for removal of operating hour limitations on the Bauxite Grinding Circuit located at Plant 1 (Emission Unit ID No. BG29) and the two Barmac Crushers (Emission Unit ID No. BG29) and the two Barmac Crushers (Emission Unit ID No. BC13 and IC40) and the Casting System (Emission Unit ID No. BC13).

The Division requested that C-E Minerals place a public notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the existing facility notifying the public of the proposed modifications and providing the opportunity for written public comment. Such public notice was placed in *The Americus Times-Recorder* (legal organ for Sumter County) on January 7, 2005. The public comment period expired on February 6, 2005.

There were no comments received from the general public, EPA, Sumter County or City of Andersonville officials.
