The AIRNOW website can be used to determine if an air quality alert of "code orange" or higher has been issued for ozone. Simply go to <u>www.airnow.gov</u>, click on either Georgia or Tennessee (depending on the county in question, see below,) on the "Today's AQI Forecast" map, then click on the name of the area in question. This will provide an air quality index (AQI) for each pollutant. If the AQI for ozone is 100 or greater, then prescribed burning is not allowed. There is also a color code for the AQI. If the color code for the AQI for ozone is orange, red, purple, or burgundy, prescribed burning is not allowed.
