


## 2022 Inflation Reduction Act authorized creation of new, two-phase \$5 billion program:

- Planning grants to develop strong climate pollution reduction strategies (\$250 M)
  - Program guidance for noncompetitive grants issued March 2023
- Competitive implementation grants to help put plans into action (\$4.6 B)
  - Notice of funding opportunity anticipated September 2023

## One planning grant, three deliverables over 4 years



## Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP)

- States/MSAs: due March 1, 2024
- Tribe/territory: due April 1, 2024
- Near-term, implementation-ready, priority greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction measures
- Prerequisite for eligible entities in the area covered by the plan to apply for implementation grants



## Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP)

- Due in 2025, 2 years after award (later for tribes and territories)
- Address all sectors and significant GHG sources/sinks
- Near- and long-term GHG emission reduction goals and strategies



#### Status Report

- Due in 2027 (N/A for tribes or territories)
- Updated analyses and plans
- Progress and next steps for key metrics

- \$3 million per state/\$1 million per MSA

#### March 1, 2024

Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) Monthly Reports

- PCAP Implementation Grants
- Competitive grant \$4.6 billion

#### June 30, 2025

Comprehensive Climate Action Plan

#### Close of 4-yr grant period

## **CPRG REQUIREMENTS – GHG INVENTORY**

- Simplified inventory is required
- Existing data
- EPA's Inventory of U.S. Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Sinks by State, US GHG Reporting Program, or National Emissions Inventory

**CCAP** 

**PCAP** 

- Comprehensive inventory is required
- All GHG emissions and sinks for the 6 key sectors
- Primary GHGs (CO2, CH4, N20, HFCs, PFCs, SF6, and NF3)

Status Report Inventory update is encouraged



## CPRG REQUIREMENTS – QUANTIFIED GHG REDUCTION MEASURES - EXAMPLES

## CPRG REQUIREMENTS – QUANTIFIED GHG REDUCTION MEASURES

PCAP

- Required for priority measures
- Estimate of GHG emissions reductions, schedule, costs, and metrics
- Near-term, high-priority, implementation-ready measures

**CCAP** 

- Full suite of implementation measures required
- Estimate of GHG emissions reductions, schedule, costs, and metrics

Status Report Status and updates are required

## BENEFITS ANALYSES: LOW-INCOME AND DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES

Step 1: Identify Communities

- Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool (https://screeningtool.geoplatform.gov/)
- Environmental Justice Screening and Mapping Tool (https://www.epa.gov/ejscreen/)

Step 2: Engage with Communities

- Community Engagement Committee
- Develop state-wide outreach
- Develop community engagement plan

Step 3: Qualitative Discussion

- What are Georgia's disadvantaged communities vulnerable to?
- Extreme heat, flooding, drought?
- How will reductions help or harm?



## Priority Climate Action Plans

- March 1, 2024
- Open to lead agency that received planning grants

# Implementation grants competition

- April 1, 2024
- •\$2 million and \$500 million
- Evaluation criteria priorities and a wide variety of GHG reduction measures contained in PCAPs
- Funding tiers allowing comparably sized projects to compete against one another



## PRIORITY CLIMATE ACTION PLAN TIMELINE









## DRAWDOWN GA GHG EMISSIONS TRACKER






### LIDAC MAP

Census tract is highlighted (gray) a disadvantaged community if:

- at or above the threshold for one or more environmental, climate, or other burdens, and
- at or above the threshold for an associated socioeconomic burden.

#### Or:

 a census tract that is completely surrounded by disadvantaged communities and is at or above the 50% percentile for low income.





## IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS ARE COMPETITIVE

- Existing Climate Action Plans

- Implementation-ready
- Overall greenhouse gas reductions and the benefits of GHG reduction measures to low-income and disadvantaged communities






