The Georgia Environmental Protection Division (GEPD) is announcing a change to the deadlines associated with Title V air permit periodic reporting and annual compliance certification to allow facilities more time to prepare them. Beginning immediately, eligible* Title V renewal permits will incorporate changes to Conditions 6.1.3, 6.1.4, and 8.14.1, extending the reporting deadline from 30 days after the reporting period to ~60 days after the reporting period.

In general, the change will be as follows: Current semiannual report deadlines: July 30 and January 30 New semiannual report deadlines: August 29 and February 28

Current quarterly report deadlines: April 30, July 30, October 30, and January 30 New quarterly report deadlines: May 30, August 29, November 29, and February 28

Current Annual Compliance Certification (ACC) deadline: January 30 New ACC deadline: February 28

If a Title V permitted facility wants to take advantage of this change before their permit is renewed, they may submit a Title V application requesting such a change in reporting deadlines now (instead of waiting for the Title V renewal permit). GEPD will process these requests as Minor Amendments Without Construction. In accordance with Georgia Rule 391-3-1-.03(10)(e)5.(i)(V)II, the facility may make the change (i.e. the change in the reporting deadlines) proposed in its minor permit modification application upon receipt of a letter from the Division acknowledging receipt of the application. To apply:

Submit a completed Title V electronic application, including certification page and disk. Along with the Title V electronic application, submit a cover letter explicitly requesting the change in the reporting deadlines; please include the current Title V permit number in letter. To ensure proper processing, please include only the request for reporting deadline change in this application; do not "bundle" any other permit changes in this application.

*Eligible: Most NSPS and NESHAP allow for alternative reporting per General Provisions 40 CFR 60.19(f) and 40 CFR 63.10(a), however GEPD has not verified that all such regulations allow such.
