Water Saving Tips for the Landscape



Use a rain gauge to determine how much it has rained over the week before watering outdoor plants.



Watering in several short sessions instead of one long session. This reduces runoff and allows water to infiltrate into soil and plant roots.

Water lawns only when they need it. Remember, spray irrigation is limited to the hours of 4pm to 10am. Not watering in the heat of the day reduces evaporation.



Use drip irrigation and soaker hoses that deliver water directly to the root zone of plants with less evaporation.

Have your irrigation system audited by a Certified Irrigation Professional to check for leaks and to insure it is running at maximum efficiency. Retrofit old irrigation heads with newer more efficient models.



Install a rain water cutoff to prevent your automatic irrigation system from watering when its raining.
