



The Environmental Protection Division (EPD) protects and restores Georgia's environment, taking the lead in ensuring clean air, water, and land. EPD:

- Serves the public by implementing and enforcing environmental laws, rules, and policies
- Engages in outreach, education, and technical assistance for citizens and for regulated companies
- Has three Branches located in the Atlanta metropolitan area:
 - Air Protection
 - Land Protection
 - Watershed Protection
- Has six District Offices located around the State:
 - Coastal District (Brunswick)
 - East Central District (Augusta)
 - Mountain District (Atlanta and Cartersville)
 - Northeast District (Athens)
 - Southwest District (Albany)
 - West Central District (Macon)

2. How often individuals who are unable to communicate in English well encounter an EPD program or activity.
3. The nature and importance of the EPD program or activity to those individuals.
4. The resources available to EPD.
