Re: Notice of BD Bard Madison Plant Delayed Compliance with Installation and Operational Dates in Paragraph 19 of the Consent Order

Dear Ms. Hays:

As a follow up to our discussion on May 11, 2020, I am writing to provide additional information on the status of the installation and operation of additional emission control systems and other related upgrades at the BD Madison facility. As I noted, BD's primary contractor for the project at Madison, POND, provided written notice to BD on May 11, 2020 that, because of various COVID-19 impacts in the supply and fabrication of steel and other components, the girders and joist critical to the construction at the BD Madison facility would not be available in time for POND to complete the project by May 31, 2020. Given these unanticipated delays, BD will be unable to complete installation and initial performance testing of additional emission controls and related upgrades by May 31, 2020 in accordance with Paragraph 19 of the Consent Order dated October 28, 2019. For your information, attached is a copy of the notice provided by POND.

At this point, based on our discussion with POND, and assuming COVID-19 does not cause additional delays in the supply chain for this project, we believe the BD Madison emissions control systems will be operable on or before June 30, 2020, in accordance with Paragraph 19 of the Consent Order. The date of final performance testing will be coordinated with EPD, tentatively scheduled on or before June 30, 2020.

Accordingly, BD is requesting that Director Dunn determine this delay constitutes a force majeure event that prevents compliance with the May 31, 2020 date in the Consent Order.
