Post-Closure Care Permit

In accordance with the provisions of the Georgia Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Act, and the Rules promulgated pursuant thereto, this permit is issued for the following operation:

Wilkinson County – McIntyre Landfill #2, a private industrial landfill located at E. S1467 Commissioner Creek, McIntyre, Georgia (Latitude 32.8597, Longitude - 83.2197).

This permit is conditioned upon the permittee complying with the attached conditions of post-closure, which are hereby made a part of this permit.

All statements in the application and supporting evidence, information, and data submitted to the Environmental Protection Division of the Department of Natural Resources have been evaluated, considered and relied upon in the issuance of this permit.

This permit is now in effect; however, under Georgia law it is subject to appeal for 30 days following issuance and is subject to modification or revocation on evidence of noncompliance: (i) with any provision of the Act or of the Rules promulgated pursuant thereto; or (ii) with any representation made in the above mentioned application or the statements and supporting data entered therein or attached thereto; or (iii) with any condition of this permit.

Conditions for Post Closure Care

1. The Permittee of the facility shall conduct post-closure care for a period of at least thirty (30) years, after the Director has issued the Closure Certificate. The Director may extend the post closure care period where necessary to adequately protect human health and the environment. The Closure Certificate for this facility was originally issued October 11, 1995.
2. The Permittee must maintain the Facility Operating Record in good order and appropriately update it to ensure compliance with the requirements of Georgia's Rules for Solid Waste Management. The Facility Operating Record must be located at the facility or at an alternate location approved by the Division.
3. The Permittee shall inspect and perform maintenance activities in accordance with the approved post-closure care plan.
4. Post-closure use of property shall not be allowed to disturb the integrity of the final cover, liner(s), or any other components of the containment system, or the function of the monitoring systems, unless the Permittee demonstrates to the Division that:
 - a. the activities will not increase the potential threat to human health or the environment; or
 - b. the activities are necessary to reduce a threat to human health or the environment.
5. Corrective action shall be implemented if environmental monitoring results indicate established standards have been exceeded or indicate a threat to human health or the environment. Notice shall be provided to the Director when a determination of elevated parameters has been made or if corrective measures are to be implemented by the Permittee. The corrective action plan must be approved by the Division as a modification of the permit.
6. If the Permittee is required to perform corrective action, a detailed written estimate, in current dollars, for hiring a third party to perform the corrective action must be prepared and submitted to the Division. The corrective action cost estimate must account for the total cost of the activities described in the corrective action plan for the entire period of time. The Permittee must annually adjust the cost estimate for inflation until the corrective action program is complete. Where corrective action is required to be performed, the Permittee must provide a financial assurance mechanism in an amount equal to the written estimate with annual updates as described above. Financial assurance must be provided continuously. The Permittee shall demonstrate that the remedy is complete through submittal of a written certification provided by a professional geologist or geotechnical engineer registered in Georgia. The Director shall release the Permittee from the financial responsibility requirement for corrective action upon concurrence of the remedy certification.

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Conditions for Post Closure Care (Continued)

7. If the Permittee or any subsequent owner or operator of the land upon which a landfill is located wishes to remove waste and waste residues, the liner, if any, or contaminated soils, the Permittee must request and receive written approval from the Division.

8. In order to request a release from the post-closure care requirements, the Permittee must notify and submit to the Director a signed certification by a professional engineer, registered to practice in Georgia, verifying that minimum post-closure care has been completed for this facility and that no imminent threat to human health or the environment exists.
