This notice is issued to inform the public of a receipt of an application for a variance submitted pursuant to a state environmental Law. Since the EPD has no authority to zone property or determine land use, only those comments addressing environmental issues related to air, water, and land protection will be considered in the application review process. Type of Permit Application: Variance to encroach within the 25-foot State waters buffer.

Applicable Law: Georgia Erosion and Sedimentation Act O.C.G.A. 12-7-1 et seq.

Description and Location of Proposed Activity:

This project will construct a multi-use trail to connect with an existing trail on a 9.48-acre site. The plan was designed with minimal buffer disturbance in mind; however, there are unavoidable areas of buffer disturbance due to existing property lines and topography. After construction the streambank will be more stable due to protective rip rap at culvert outfalls, hard armoring where the slope is extremely steep and severely eroded, pedestrian bridges limiting foot traffic in the buffer, and multi-trophic native riparian vegetation placed in all practicable locations. The proposed project will result in 3,040 total linear feet (44,858 total ft²) of buffer disturbance lasting approximately 32 weeks located near Mill Creek and Haig Mill Creek in the Conasauga Watershed.

The application for a variance must include an approved Erosion and Sediment Control Plan with control measures based on sound conservation and engineering practices which meet or exceed the standards in the "Manual for Erosion and Sediment Control in Georgia" and which will minimize erosion and deposition of sediments on adjacent lands or into State waters.
