Description and Location of Proposed Activity:

The project, GDOT PI 0012884, will install a multi-use trail and associated slopes. Phase II buffer intrusions are related to adding permanent impervious fill for trail construction and will be mitigated with native riparian vegetation where practicable. The proposed project will result in approximately 67 linear feet (1,263 square feet) of buffer disturbance. The site is located on an unnamed tributary of Beaver Ruin Creek from Burns Road to Willow Trail Parkway in the Upper Ocmulgee Watershed (03070103).
