Recycling and Waste Diversion Grant

The RWD Grant furthers the goals of the SWTF by providing financial support to projects in Georgia to reduce solid waste, recover valuable materials, support manufacturing, and encourage innovation.

Project Types

The RWD Grant allows eligible applicants to develop project proposals that best support their communities' needs. Projects must focus on increasing recycling, reducing waste, and/or diverting recoverable materials from the solid waste stream as described in the <u>authorized uses of the SWTF</u>.

Examples of RWD Grant projects may include, but are not limited to:

- Recycling and Waste Diversion Infrastructure
- Hub and Spoke Development
- Hard-to-Recycle Materials
- Recovery of Additional Materials
- Waste Reduction
- Innovation

Eligibility

Local government entities, including counties, municipalities, or any combination of the same, public authorities, agencies, commissions, or institutions are eligible to apply and receive funding.
