

## **40 CFR §279.22(c) “Labeling during Used Oil Storage by Used Oil Generators”**

[which is incorporated into §391-3-11-.17 of the Georgia Rules for Hazardous Waste Management by reference]

---

§279.22(c) states, the following:

(c) *Labels.*

- (1) Containers and aboveground tanks used to store used oil at generator facilities must be labeled or marked clearly with the words “Used Oil.
  - (2) Fill pipes used to transfer used oil into underground storage tanks at generator facilities must be labeled or marked clearly with the words “Used Oil.”

Used oil generators are required to label containers and tanks storing used oil and fills pipes to underground storage tanks containing used oil with the words “Used Oil.” The labeling on container, tank or fill pipe should be legible and clearly visible by approaching individuals. The facility should inspect their shop, maintenance areas, or any areas where used oil would be generated or stored looking for containers holding used oil to ensure that all containers, tanks, or fill pipes are properly marked.

Suggestions to prevent violations of this rule include the following:

- Training of personnel involved in used oil management at the facility;
- Inspections of shops, maintenance areas, or any areas where used oil would be generated or stored looking for containers holding used oil to ensure that all containers, tanks, or fill pipes are properly marked. Look for oil drain pans, pails and other likely storage vessels in these areas that may also be storing used oil.
- Maintaining a supply of pre-printed “Used Oil” labels and placing them on containers and tanks likely to hold used oil for a period of time.
