1. Comment:

The Chattahoochee Riverkeeper (Riverkeeper) urges the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (GA EPD) to add a provision to the permit stating that the permit will be reopened within 18 months of the adoption of the final TMDL to incorporate additional requirements for the facility to ensure water quality standards are met.

Response:

GA EPD agrees that once a TMDL is finalized and approved by EPA, permits will be re-opened or modified as needed to be consistent with the TMDL. Language has been included in the permit to ensure the permit is reopened to incorporate additional requirements in the TMDL.
