Maintenance Plan and Redesignation Request for the Rome, Georgia (Floyd County), Annual PM<sub>2.5</sub> Nonattainment Area

Dear Ms. Fleming:

With this letter, the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD) is submitting for approval and incorporation the proposed revisions to Georgia's State Implementation Plan (SIP) to include a plan, consistent with §175A of the Clean Air Act to provide for maintenance of the 1997 Annual PM<sub>2.5</sub> National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) in the Rome area. This submittal also serves as a request that the Rome Nonattainment Area be redesignated as an area attaining the 1997 Annual PM<sub>2.5</sub> NAAQS.

On April 5, 2011, EPA published a final rule determining that the Rome Area had attained the 1997 fine particulate matter standards. On September 8, 2011, EPA published a final rule making a determination that the Rome Area had attained the 1997 annual PM<sub>2.5</sub> standard prior to the April 5, 2010, attainment date. Georgia EPD withdrew its previous submittal of nonattainment planning documents for the Rome Area in a letter to EPA dated June 29, 2011. The emissions inventory submitted with the October 20, 2009, SIP revision to comply with the Clean Air Act requirements of §172 for nonattainment areas was not affected by the June 20, 2011, request.

The public notice for the proposed SIP revision was advertised using the EPD Air Protection Branch listserv mailing list for public notices. No comments were received. However, Georgia's Heavy Duty Diesel Engines rule [391-3-1-.02(2)(000)] was removed from Section 2.3.2 of the prehearing SIP, which is the discussion of state measures that have contributed to permanent and enforceable emissions reductions in the Rome Area. Rule (000) was removed because the version currently in the approved SIP is identical to the requirements of national rule and the most recent rule revision has not been approved by EPA.

As required by the federal SIP-processing regulations, we have enclosed certifications that the required public notices were provided and that a public hearing was held. We have also enclosed the administrative and technical support checklists to satisfy the SIP submittal completeness criteria. This submittal includes one paper copy of each of the relevant documents and a compact disk with an electronic version of the documents. The electronic version is an exact duplicate of the paper copy.
