On behalf of United Technologies Corporation (UTC), AECOM Technical Services, Inc. (AECOM) is submitting this letter as Semi-Annual Progress Report #01 (July 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015) for the activities conducted at the former United Technologies Automotive facility located at 1884 Warrenton Highway, Thomson, Georgia (Site). In a letter dated June 30, 2015, the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD) approved the March 12, 2015 Voluntary Remediation Program (VRP) Application submitted by AECOM pursuant to the Georgia Voluntary Remediation Program Act. EPD's approval letter requested the first semi-annual progress report by January 5, 2016.

Several questions and comments were included with the EPD VRP June 30th approval letter. AECOM responded to those questions and comments in a response to comments (RTC) letter dated October 16, 2015 which is currently under review by the EPD.

AECOM is also submitting the first Annual Groundwater Monitoring Report along with this semi-annual progress letter; the Annual Groundwater Monitoring Report includes a summary of the groundwater sampling which occurred in June 2015.

A summary of activities during the past 6-months are discussed below.

1. Actions which have been taken toward achieving compliance during this period:

- AECOM prepared the 2015 Annual Groundwater Monitoring Report.
- A Uniform Environmental Covenant (UEC) is being prepared to ensure future control of site-related exposure pathways. Discussions are ongoing with Pelzer on finalizing a draft UEC for the agency to review.

2. Results of sampling and tests and all other data received during the reporting period:

- The 2015 Annual Groundwater Monitoring Report is being submitted concurrent with this progress report which discusses the groundwater sampling results from June 2015.

4. **Actions, data, and plans which are scheduled for next semi-annual period:**

- AECOM will conduct the 2016 groundwater monitoring event in June 2016.

5. **Unresolved or anticipated delays, and efforts made to mitigate those delays or anticipated delays:**

- No delays have been encountered during this reporting period.

6. **Modifications to the proposed schedule or approach during this reporting period:**

- No modifications are proposed or were approved during this reporting period.
