[	]	- At least 2 years of experience in a related field or in the building trades. Submit a <b>completed</b> certification application on forms provided by the Division with al appropriate information included. This would also include <b>original signature and date</b> .
[	]	Submit an <b>original initial Lead Supervisor course completion training certificate</b> . Training must be taken from a Georgia accredited training program. A list of Georgia Accredited Training programs is available upon request. Original documents shall be returned upor issuance or denial of certification by the Division.
[	]	Submit an <b>original third party certification exam letter in the Lead Supervisor discipline</b> confirming successful completion of said exam. Original documents shall be returned upor issuance or denial of certification by the Division.

[ ]	Submit original initial Lead Supervisor course completion training certificate and original initial Lead Project Designer course completion training certificate. Training must be taken from a Georgia accredited training program. A list of Georgia Accredited Training program is available upon request. Original documents shall be returned upon issuance or denial of certification by the Division.

If the Company has individuals who are certified Lead Workers, Inspectors, Supervisors, Risk Assessors, or Project Designers, the firm must also be certified.				
[]	Submit a <b>completed</b> certification application on forms supplied by the Division certifying that the firm shall:			
	- Only employ Division certified employees to conduct lead-based paint activities			
	<ul> <li>Follow standards in Rule 391-3-2406 for conducting lead-based paint activities and</li> </ul>			
[ ]	- Maintain all records pursuant to the requirements in Rule 391-3-2406. Submit a disclosure statement of any action taken by EPA or an EPA authorized program involving violations, suspensions, revocations, or modifications of a firm's activities.			
[ ]	Submit a fee in the amount of \$500.00 in the form of a check or money order and made payable to the Environmental Protection Division - Lead Fees.
